

Institutional Effectiveness Plan

The process of constructing a pā pōhaku (rock wall) is one that requires patience and collaboration. Various hands carry and place various rocks in a way that creates a solid foundation upon which the pā pōhaku can rise. Every single stone, from the smallest 'ili'ili (pebble) to the larger pōhaku kihi (cornerstone), are integral to the creation and stability of a pā pōhaku.
