INTENSIVE ENGLISH PROGRAM

NON-CREDIT

- In December, OCET will launch a statewide 240 hour Electrical Technology Program that meets requirements for a state law that went into effect on July 1, 2013. This law requires training from the University of Hawaii community college prior to becoming eligible for journey worker electrician, journey worker specialty electrician, supervising electrician, and maintenance electrician examinations. Other campuses involved include HonCC, Leeward CC, Maui College and Kauai CC.
