APPRENTICESHIP

 Wilt Watanabe, the apprenticeship coordinator, reports that this semester there are approximately 159 apprentices enrolled in evening and Saturday classes on our campus, Kealakehe Intermediate, Kealakehe High, Kona Industries and on Oahu. Classes began on Aug. 7th and continue until Dec. 20th. The various trades include masons and plasterers; carpenters; electricians; sheetmetal; refrigeration and air conditioning; and plumbers and pipefitters.

INTENSIVE ENGLISH PROGRAM

 The IEP has 18 new students and 14 returning students attending this first session. Students come not only from Japan but also China, Korea, Thailand, Philippines and Brazil.
