Response, Sara Vogel: We can reassemble the old team or create a new one. Either way, we need to make the survey happen.

Response, Reshela DuPuis: The previous task force was organized under the Chancellor. We need College Council representation. Possible options: 1) We consider a motion

to create a new Council task force to review and create the instrument; this will delay deployment); 2) We consider a motion to deploy the survey as is.

Response, Sara Vogel: Any survey is a one-shot picture. There is already lots of information about the campus climate. This is only one tool. The real work is in analyzing the data. Separate conversations on getting feedback are not going anywhere. We need to move forward, need to implement processes and procedures.
