A. Staffing Plan Update: VCSA Jodi Mine

FY24 Hawaii CC Staffing Plan HawCC Integrated Planning Timeline approved 2023-05-05 the listing: Filled positions are at the top, the next section is posted positions with closing dates. Those closed are with the Screening/Interview Committee or not-filled, but need to be re-advertised.

Staffing Plan - this is not all the vacancies that we have. The listing includes the ones that the Admin Team, looking at concerns, are the positions that are going out for recruitment. They are not in any particular order. The Pool of vacancies is growing as more people leave. Some positions may be re-described. A month-and-a-half is the time from posting to filling an APT position. APT positions need to meet classification standards. Civil Service takes longer because it's reviewed by various offices (DHRD, OHR, etc). Inputting in PeopleSoft takes longer and is more complicated than the old system. Re-descriptions for positions filled within the past year, with no real change in responsibilities can move forward quickly. Some positions change over time and need to be re-described. The work environment for the position also changes. External factors delay the process when trying to fill the position temporarily versus filling it permanently. Difficult to balance the time. I do hear you, and we are all in the same boat. Working together, we can get it finalized. Asking for patience, and we understand the push.

**Question**, Grace Funai: Has it been considered to retain rather than recruit? Noticed a couple of positions where we already have people and pushing those positions up as a

priority. They're currently in a temporary position, can we put them in the position, where we know we have people and give them a fair opportunity to apply.

Jodi: depends on the position you're looking at. Civil Service, position in existence, we can hire 89-day hire. We should be able to push, unless position needs to be redescribed. It takes a long time when OHR reviews. Example: Janitor - even though we hired 2-3 years ago, we still need to review the PD.

**Comment**, Toni Cravens-Howell: I made a similar comment during Faculty Senate re: Faculty positions - could the Screening Committee meet earlier, before the job advertisement closes? It would significantly improve the timeline.

**Comment**, Carrie Mospens: That is the current process. The Committee is created before the closing date.

**Comment**, Sherise Tiogangco: Which positions are permanent or temporary? Which ones are re-described and which are good to go?

**Response**, Jodi Mine: I gave up my office's budget position to re-describe into Contracts & Grants APT. Some Civil Service are being updated. Non-instructional Faculty can be hired at any point. These are various stages. Too much work to update daily. Trying to keep up with Administrators. I will be updating the list, as we submit

**Comment**, Kate De Soto: The policy allows a 3-year cycle during which an employee can receive funds.
