Noted that UHH requires 6 quantitative reasoning credits with at least 3 credits designated as Math and that articulation is a concern. Debated whether or not students need to get to Math 100. Argued that students should have choices. Suggested that requirements be aligned with UHH in accordance with the AA task force.</p> <p>Motion to vote on friendly amendment: (call for secret ballot Nahm-Mijo /Savage) “Math 100 or any higher math course that meets GE quantitative reasoning.” 14 yes 17 no 2 abstentions. Friendly amendment did not carry.</p> <p>Move to postpone proposal to modify AA program and send proposal back to AA task force. (Schumaker).
