The CES survey results showed **51** participants

There were two questions proposed that were created at Leeward CC. The first asked:

## How would you rate the overall quality of this course? Scoring: Very Poor, Poor, Average, Good, Excellent-Highest score of 37.3%

How would you rate the overall effectiveness of this course? Scoring Very Poor, Poor, Average, Good, Excellent-Lowest score of 27.5%

This course helped advance my educational goals. Scoring: Strongly disagree, Disagree, Neutral, Agree, Strongly agree-**Second highest score of 35.3%** 

The second asked:

Should the open ended question "Other Comments" be included as a campus level question on all course? Yes-70.6%

No-29.4%

## The following level one-Campus questions were included as option 3

- 1. The learning environment supported my ability to communicate in a variety of situations
- 2. My experience in this course has developed my critical thinking and problem solving skills
- 3. The course has supported me to contribute to my community in ways that are respectful of Hawai'i Island culture and the wider global community
- 4. I have learned about campus services and resources to support my college success and life-long learning
- 5. I felt that the course provided a safe, healthy, and respectful learning environment

# Yes I want to use all these 5 HawCC questions in level I Campus questions-31.4% No I prefer a single question in Option 1 and possibly an open ended question-68.6%
