After it was voted to move to Foundations at the 1/17/17 Academic Senate meeting, VCAA Joni Onishi called AS degree stakeholders together to discuss general education issues for AS degrees on May 5, 2017. At that meeting, it was voted on and approved that "HawCC AS Degree Programs will follow the same General Education (Foundation/Diversifications) designation process as the AA Degree Programs." The AS programs were also included in the paperwork passed by the Senate for Foundations proposals. However, in order to make it official for the UH System Foundations Board portfolio and for accreditation, the GEC felt like this should also be voted on from the full Academic Senate.

	Motion to accept that HawCC AS Degree Programs will follow the same General Education (Foundations/Diversifications) designation process as the AA Degree Programs. (Hu/Phillips) Discussion: Concern was voiced that the Quantitative Reasoning (QR) requirement for Foundations may cause some issues for certain AS degrees. Currently, up to five public service programs do not require MATH100. These degrees currently allow PHIL110 in place of MATH100. If students are not planning to use their AS degree specifically for transfer, it may be possible their progress to graduation will be delayed by the new QR requirement that comes with Foundations. It was requested to hold off on the vote until next month so some of these issues can be vetted. It was suggested that this could be evaluated on a case-by-case basis, even with Foundations. A memo could be completed to ensure a student gets a specific catalog year if needed. One concern was for accreditation - that if some AS degrees are left out of Foundations, designation of courses will not be consistent.	.=	DATE
