# **High Priority #1 - First Year Success**

### Alignments:

- WIG #2: Achieve Student Success
- HGI: Increase college attendance
- HGI: Improve retention and promote persistence
- HGI: Solidify Palamanui and establish large scale student support

#### Success Measures:

- Number of students who successfully completed year 1 classes
  - Completed right 30 credits in a clear pathway
  - Completed 9 credits in first semester in area of interest
  - Completed appropriate English and Math in first year
- Number of students who re-enrolled for second year
  - Fall to Spring enrollment
  - Fall to Fall enrollment

#### Strategies

- 1. Students will enroll in appropriate math and English within their first semester/year
  - a. Sequence & STAR: Kanoe, Joni, Melanie (discuss w/LA DCs)
  - b. Update Advising Sheet Liberal Arts to include sequencing similar to CTE programs (for all concentrations). Recommended sequence built in STAR: Kenoa
  - c. Reach out to students early regarding placement: Glenn-Dee, Lisa
- 2. Summer Bridge program for direct from High School Students
  - a. TLC workshops (placement prep/refresher): Lisa, Glenn-Dee
  - b. Identify students, partner with ENG/MATH to run a Dev-Ed class: Lisa, Glenn-Dee (note: look at FA options for incoming students)
- 3. Increase AVID participation for student engagement : AVID team, Joni, Melanie
  - a. Build FYE component into 1st year classes ("Maui model")
- 4. Increase use of in-class tutors: Lisa, DCs

- 5. Build strong and stable STAR tool: Kanoe, builders, STAR team
- 6. Student will have a graduation plan (automatically done through STAR)
  - a. Work with students on academic probation (and possibly those referred through MySuccess) to create an individualized plan: Counselors
  - b. Plan for students to complete right 30 credits in a clear pathway: DCs, Melanie, and Kanoe
  - c. Plan for students to complete 9 credits in first semester in area of interest: DCs, Melanie, and Kanoe
  - d. Plan for students to complete appropriate English and Math in first year: DCs, Melanie, and Kanoe
  - e. Build in success planning into TLC workshops: Lisa
- 7. Mandatory advising for first-time, never attended students: Counseling
  - a. Faculty advisors? Melanie, Kenoa
  - b. Advise students to complete right 30 credits in a clear pathway: Kenoa, Counseling
  - c. Advise students to complete 9 credits in first semester in area of interest: Kenoa, Counseling
  - d. Advise students to complete appropriate English and Math in first year: Kenoa, Counseling
- 8. Establish sense of community for newly admitted students (communication plan): Thatcher, Admin
  - a. Signal Vine, Mongoose
- 9. Increase faculty use of early alert and referrals: Joni, Melanie
  - a. Build in referral component: Larissa, Mari
- 10. Look into Intake Survey data, and see how it can be used

- 1. Build a strong and stable STAR tool: Kanoe, STAR team, builders

- 3. Work with system consortium to develop academic pathways to 4 year
  - a. System ISS Transfer group on pause: Kanoe, Kenoa
  - b. Hybrid Pathways- maps journey based on terminal degree/transfer campus based on current degree/campus (Gary/STAR): Kanoe
  - c. 5-wk online 2+2: Joni, Leanne
- 4. Adjust tuition rate for 2-year students taking 4-year courses: Joni
- 5. Include secondary degrees into STAR Conferral Reports: Kanoe
- University Center Hawai'i Island (extend UH Center services island-wide): Chancellor, Raynette, Kanoe, Melanie
- 7. Increase awareness of Auto-admission: Counseling
