
➤ UHCC Transfers to Mānoa:

- ★UH Mānoa Native First-Time Freshmen Average credits at graduation (cumulative) = 136









- ➤ Funded under US Department of Labor

- Wrap around student and academic




Adult Basic Ed With Workforce Ready Focus: "Ready, Set, Grow"

- ➤ Provide students with academic skills that allow them to enter community college degree programs with no more than 1 semester of developmental education.
- ➤ Provide students with both soft skills and basic academic skills required for employment in the State as evidenced by a recognized work-readiness credential.








- ➤ Target population
 - ★Age 16+ who are out-of-school
 - ★May be unemployed, underemployed, or a dislocated worker
 - ★Scoring no lower than 6th grade or higher than 9th grade in Math and English
 - ★No high school diploma or GED required
