– Dual Enrollment Programs –Jump Start

- + High school seniors enrolled at CCs in CTE programs
- ◆ DOE pays the tuition
- Student transfers college credits back to DOE for high school graduation



– Dual Enrollment Programs –Jump Start

First year (2011-2012): 13 students participated from 4 high schools in the following program: Carpentry, Administration of Justice, MELE (Music and Learning), Culinary, Fashion Tech, Early Childhood, Welding, Paralegal

Results: 10 students completed of which 6 enrolled at a UHCC in Fall 2012.

Future plans: Kaua'i CC and Leeward CC plan on participating with their area high schools.

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- Dual Enrollment Programs - DCAPS

Dual Credit Articulated Program of Study(DCAPS)

- Formal evaluation system for high school students taking high school classes to earn college credit in CTE programs
- Usually involves end of course evaluation
- + Five DCAPS agreements for CISCO, A+, Marketing, Retailing and Entrepreneurship
- → No students have earned college credits

Future Plans

→ DCAPS agreements for Education, Culinary Arts & HOST

Overview

- + Free, fast-track career and workforce certificate program
- + Reading, writing, math, data and computer skills
- Prepare students for college or career

Early Results

- 122 students enrolled and 78% retained in program
- + 64% increased raw score by one grade level on post tests
- → 60% persisted into credit classes
- + 66% earned National Career Readiness Certificate

GOAL: Roll out plans to other campuses offering iCAN to support their ABE programs.



-Transfer - Ka'ie'ie

- ★ Ka'ie'ie students treated like UHM students
- Student access to UHM advisors, including departmental advisors
- Students participate in UHM departmental communication and activities
- → Can register at UHM while at the CC
- → Transfer as a continuing student

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-Transfer -15 to Finish




In supporting the Hawai'i Graduation Initiative, "15 to Finish" was introduced as a media campaign encouraging students to take 15 credits a semester to finish in two years for an associate's degree and in four years for a baccalaureate degree.

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





- Distance Learning & Educational Technology Initiative
- → UH Engineering Consortium
- → Na Pua No'eau
- Statewide Longitudinal Data System
- → West O'ahu Campus Build-out Support

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UH Innovation Initiative

- Companion to Hawai'i Grad Initiative: grads need jobs...
- → Focused on growing the research economy in Hawai'i to \$1 Billion (now \$500 Million)
- Supported by the Chamber, Enterprise Honolulu, Hawai'i Executive Council, and several other private sector groups

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UH Innovation Initiative

- Systemwide initiative that will align projects, degrees, and other activities with research sectors (e.g., clean energy research, net zero model home, biofuel, food security, etc.)
- Increase commercialization of research and entrepreneurship focus at 4-year and 2-year campuses
- → A 3 biennium initiative aiming to hire 50 world class Principal Investigators (PI), create a new economy of innovation, and focus the UH system on entrepreneurship and innovation at all levels.
